## GHHM Course Overview

The Global Health & Humanitarian Medicine (GHHM) course is designed to equip medical doctors with medical knowledge and skills required to work effectively in resource-constrained settings and humanitarian crisis contexts. The GHHM course prepares students to sit the Diploma in [Global Health](#). The Diploma in Global Health (DGH) is a newly established qualification, developed and awarded by the Royal College of Physicians (RCP) in collaboration with Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF). GHHM is also a preparatory course for the Diploma in Hygiene and Tropical Medicine (DTM&H) exam.

### Who can apply

- A qualified medical doctor with more than two years of clinical work experience, who is willing to commit six to eight hours of self-directed learning per week, in addition to attending weekly online webinars
- We especially welcome applications from locally hired MSF doctors and women doctors working in low- or middle-income countries.

### How we teach

GHHM is a part-time, online, blended learning course designed to deliver high-quality training. The programme starts in September and runs for 9 months, ending in May.

We cover our course material in a variety of ways –

- weekly seminars (every Tuesday 18.00-20.00 UK time for the Africa, Europe and the Americas cohort and Thursdays 16.00-18.00 IST for the Asia and Oceania cohort)
- online quizzes
- group case-based discussions
- online pre-recorded lectures
- minimum 12 hours parasitology training
- interactive parasitology app access
- interactive webinars
- public health assignments.

### After GHHM

Having completed GHHM, learners will have access to GHHM's Alumni Network – a growing community of former GHHM students from around the world. This community provides access to networking and mentoring opportunities, learning resources and medical guidelines to support you in your clinical work after GHHM.
