Nursing II year students - Batch of 2023) in Guvvakallu village, Chittoor Mandal, Chittoor District from 17th to 22nd March 2025. The NSS Programme Officer was Mrs. Thamarai Selvi, Sociology Demonstrator, the Assistant Programme Officer was Mr. John Wesley, M.Sc. Nursing Tutor, and the camp coordinators were Mrs. Grace Angeline, Associate Professor & Mrs. Sophia Pearcy, M.Sc. Nursing Tutor. Mrs. Melitta G, Ms. Namitha D & Ms. Clovieya P, Tutors and Ms. Keerthana H and Ms. M Vasudhavani, Junior Staff Nurses from the College of Nursing guided the students in the camp activities.

Inauguration of the Camp:

The Camp was inaugurated on 14th March 2025 at the College of Nursing, CMC Vellore, Chittoor Campus. Mrs. Bindhu. P., Professor, College of Nursing, Chittoor Campus, welcomed the gathering and introduced the Chief Guest, Mrs. Y.V. Rajeshwari, State Mahila Vice President and Ex APWCFCD, Chittoor, followed by devotion led by Rev. Giftus Joshua, Chaplain. Mrs. Y.V. Activities carried out by the NSS Volunteers:

Village Health Survey: A health survey was conducted in Guvvakallu village to assess health issues, socioeconomic and nutritional status of children, antenatal and postnatal women, and the productive age group.

School Health Programme: There were 27 children Govt. Elementary school and 10 children of Balwadi, in Guvvakallu village, were screened, revealing common health issues like malnutrition, anaemia, dental caries, eye infections, and colds. Health education was provided, and iron supplements were recommended.

Rally: An awareness rally for World Water Day was organised to promote water conservation. Flagged off by Mr. Kumar, the Village Sarpanch, the event included a talk by Mr. John Wesley, M.Sc. Nursing Tutor, and a march with placards and slogans on water conservation.

Environmental Sanitation and Tree Plantation: NSS volunteers in Guvvakallu village cleaned the streets, removed plastic waste under the 'No Plastic' initiative, and planted saplings around the Subcentre and Sachivalayam.

NIV CME Workshop: Transforming Care

The Non-Invasive Ventilation (NIV) CME Workshop, titled Transforming Care: NIV Essentials for Today's Critical Care Therapists, was successfully conducted on 14th March, 2025 with the participation of critical care therapists, nurses and doctors. The event was organized by the faculty Doctors and Therapists of the Department of Critical Care under the leadership of Dr. Binila Chacko and Dr. A. Thomas Isiah Sudarsan. This course was designed to equip health care professionals with the essential knowledge and hands-on skills needed to optimise non-invasive ventilation for patients.

Event Highlights

The workshop commenced with the inauguration and prayer by Chaplain Rev. Vijayakumar. The academic sessions consisted of essential topics on Basic Physiology and Mechanics of NIV, bedside use of NIV in critically ill patients with various forms of Respiratory failure and the application of NIV / HFNC in other ICU settings. These comprised didactic lectures and intuitively designed hands-on stations for the participants. The event concluded with the quiz competition on the subject of the CME, and prizes as well as participation certificates were distributed. The workshop witnessed the enthusiastic participation of healthcare professionals, including Critical Care Therapists, Nurses and Trainee doctors. We extend our sincere gratitude to the Medical Superintendent's Office, Principal's Office, and the Nursing Service Department for their unwavering support in organizing this successful workshop. 3rd Empowered to Excel as Efficient Leaders Training Programme

The 3rd – Empowered to Excel As Efficient Leaders Training Programme (EXCEL) was held on 12th March, 2025. This programme, attended by 18 participants, is a collaborative effort by the Department of Hospital Management Studies & Staff Training and Development, the Directorate of HR, Mission Department and the Principal's Office. EXCEL aims to equip doctors with essential management knowledge and leadership skills for hospital operations, particularly in mission hospital settings. The sessions were interactive and equipped the participants with essential knowledge.

Mr. Paul Chandrakumar, Treasurer, handled a thought-provoking session on "Financial Management" covering essential concepts in Accounts and Finance, Budgeting & financial control. Mrs. Divya, Legal Officer, delivered an information-filled session on "Legal Issues in Mission Hospitals - Key points to prevent patients' litigations", highlighting and emphasising the Consumer Protection Act and Statutory Requirement & licensing. Diploma in Hospital Administration (DHA)



The Department of Hospital Management Studies & Staff Training and Development (DHMSSTD), Christian Medical College Vellore, in collaboration with the Christian Medical Association of India (CMAI), New Delhi, started the Diploma in Hospital Administration (Distance Education Programme) course from 2019. This course was designed mainly for those working in the mission Hospitals willing to acquire the knowledge and skills needed to become efficient managers and leaders while continuing to serve their institutions. It is designed to equip the participants to integrate theoretical and scientific frameworks with their own experience to implement best practices in their hospitals, which would provide them the ability to deal with a range of management issues.

The sixth batch of participants had their mandatory contact programme from 10th to 22nd March 2025 at CMC Vellore. The contact classes started with prayer and a welcome address by Dr. Anila Chacko, Academic Officer representing the Principal, Dr. Solomon Sathishkumar. Mrs. Elsy Thomas, Secretary of the CMAI Administrator's section, also addressed the participants. Reynolds Memorial Hospital in Washim, is an 89-year-old hospital, located in Vidarbha region of Maharashtra. Started in 1936 by Dr. Orpha Speicher an American missionary, from the Church of the Nazarene, it evolved from a mud walled school building to a thriving hospital and also pioneered in Nursing education to empower the local community

The region of Vidarbha figures as one of the worst drought-hit regions in the country and has been known for high farmer suicide rates. There is a great need for ethical, cost-effective medical care and also opportunity to bring about positive change in the region. A functional hospital committed towards delivering wholistic compassionate care is the need. Moreover, a base hospital is essential to continue training of qualified nurses who would respond to needs of the region

Since 2017 the hospital is managed under a tripartite management of Christian Medical College Vellore, Emmanuel Hospital Association and the Church of the Nazarene.


