CMC Vellore, Ranipet Marks World Thalassemia Day



The Department of Haematology, CMC Ranipet Campus, organised a Thalassemia Awareness Programme on May 8, 2026 to commemorate “World Thalassemia Day”. The event was held in the A-Block foyer with the theme; “Hidden No More: Finding the Undiagnosed, Supporting the Unseen.” The programme was initiated by Dr. Aby Abraham, Head of Department, along with Dr. Sharon Lionel Professor, Dr. Eunice Sindhuvi, Professor; Mrs. Lillian Percy Kujur, HOU Speciality Nursing and coordinated by Mrs. Gomathi Joseph, Senior Social Worker. The aim was to emphasise the importance of creating Thalassemia awareness and Stem Cell Transplants among the general public. Nauguration was hosted by Dr. Eunice Sindhuvi; the event began with prayer by Mr. Ebenezer, Chaplain. Dr. Biju George, Director, delivered the felicitation address and highlighted that thalassemia is curable in children. The curative approach involves prevention is possible through screening and prenatal diagnosis. Currently, stem cell transplantation is the only curative option available. In the future, gene therapy may also become an option.

Dr. Victor Clough Rambo, former head of ophthalmology (1947-1957) is recognised as the first person in the world to conduct large-scale eye camps; taking mobile cataract surgery programmes directly to villages and restoring sight to thousands of people. His pioneering outreach model transformed community eye care and inspired similar programmes across the globe.

Dr. Vikram Mathews, Senior Professor motivated the public and thanked Coal India and Thalssemics India for the transplant programme. He mentioned that social workers and the entire team was present to inform the public about the work done by each team. He requested that the public can learn from each team and take this knowledge to explain the function of each team and educate others in their local communities.

Dr. Aby Abraham, Head, emphasised the need for awareness of thalassemia, prevention and stem cell transplantation as a curative for thalassemia. He also mentioned that the first stem cell transplant for thalassemia in India was performed at Christian Medical College 40 years ago.

The awareness stalls were inaugurated by Dr. Biju George by cutting the ribbon. At the Physician stall, Dr. Jat Neelam Kumari Ramdayal, Assistant Professor, addressed clinical aspects of thalassemia and clarified queries from the public. The staff from the Blood Bank explained the importance of blood donation to save someone's life. Mrs. Dhanalakshmi, Clinical Assistant, was helping the volunteers. The Laboratory stall was led by Mr. Neelagandan K, Sr. Technician and his team, including Ms. Shankari Devi, Senior Technician. They covered thalassemia screening, prenatal screening, and hemoglobinopathy. Carrier screening was conducted for 20 individuals.



The Nursing stall, organised by Mrs. Margaret Devadanam, highlighted the role of nurses in thalassemia care. Her team used posters to educate the public on causes, signs, symptoms, and consequences of thalassemia. Nursing Coordinators, Mrs. Devakirubai Mohan, Mrs. Beulah Augustine, Mrs. Manjula M, Mrs. Philomena B, and Ms. Devakirubai N conducted multiple puppet shows to explain thalassemia, screening, and treatment options were most highlighted and admired by the children and families. Announcements in Hindi were made by Clinical Assistant- Ms. Arifa. Arrangements and decorations were managed by Mrs. Gomathi Joseph and Mrs. Kavitha Raju Senior Office Facilitator, including special decorations to attract children with a balloon stand and selfie stand.

Winter Symposium on Airway Disorders and ALLERGOCON 2026



The Departments of Pulmonary Medicine and Respiratory Medicine at Christian Medical College, Vellore, hosted the Winter Symposium on Airway Disorders and ALLERGOCON 2026 from 29th to 31st January 2026, bringing together leading global experts, clinicians, and researchers for three days of rigorous academic exchange. This symposium was planned to honour the legacy of Dr. D.J. Christopher, a pioneering pulmonologist, visionary leader, and devoted servant of the institution. His life and work have left an indelible mark on generations of patients, trainees, and peers. The event drew a diverse audience of medical students, postgraduates, researchers, consultants, and allied health professionals.

The symposium featured world-renowned authorities, including Dr James D. Chalmers, Dr Shyamali Dharmage, Dr Jerry Krishnan, Dr Amelia Shoemark, Dr Raja Dhar, Dr Sundeep Salvi, and Dr Sally Singh, who delivered cutting-edge presentations spanning bronchiectasis, COPD, asthma epidemiology, and pulmonary rehabilitation. The scientific programme was enriched by challenging case discussions and engaging panel discussions that fostered interactive learning. **The Winter Symposium oral presentation winners were: 1st Prize – Dr Jewell Joseph, 2nd Prize – Dr Subiksha, and 3rd Prize – Dr Priyanka.**

ALLERGOCON 2026, themed "From Bench to Bedside," featured the prestigious Shelden Spector Oration delivered by Dr Saibal Moitra on "The Allergy Practice in India: Past, Present and Future." The scientific program encompassed sessions on diagnostic testing, drug allergy, food allergy, skin disorders, and inborn errors of immunity. Interactive workshops offered hands-on training in allergy skin testing, component-resolved diagnostics, pulmonary rehabilitation, and lung oscillometry. ALLERGOCON oral abstract presentations, judged by Dr. Vinay Mehta, Dr. M.T. Krishna, and Dr. Saibal Moitra, showcased vital ongoing research. **The winners were: 1st Prize – Dr. Arya Gopi, 2nd Prize – Dr Sivatheertha V.S, and 3rd Prize – Dr. Mosam Maroo.**

The event served as a vital platform for inspiring young clinicians and fostering innovation in tackling airway and allergic disorders. A memorable highlight was the dedicated session honouring the legacy of Professor D.J. Christopher.

Balamugesh), and the Indian Chest Society leadership (Dr Raja Dhar), who paid tribute to his enduring leadership and national impact on respiratory medicine. Cochrane Systematic Reviews, GRADE & Evidence to Decision & Guideline Development Workshop

The Cochrane India, CMC Vellore Affiliate conducted a two-and-a-half-day workshop on “Cochrane Systematic Reviews, GRADE, and the Evidence-to-Decision (EtD) Framework” from 05 to 07 May 2026. This was followed by a one-and-a-half-day workshop on “Guideline Development,” organised by the Technical Resource Hub under the Department of Health Research, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, from 7th to 8th May 2026 at the CHTC Lecture Hall, Bagayam Campus, Christian Medical College Vellore. The inauguration ceremony of the Cochrane systematic reviews, GRADE, EtD & Guideline Development Workshop commenced with a word of prayer by Rev. Vanisha, Chaplain, followed by the Chief guest’s address by Dr. Jacob John, Additional Vice-Principal Research, CMC Vellore and welcome address by Dr. Mohan S. Kamath, Director, Cochrane India Affiliate, CMC Vellore and Principal Investigator of the Technical Resource Hub CMC Vellore, Head and Senior Professor, Department of Reproductive Medicine & Surgery, welcomed the participants and provided a brief introduction about the Cochrane unit and the workshop. The session concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Dr. Mohan S. Kamath.



The workshop was conducted over four days, covering key concepts of systematic review, Meta-analysis and practical applications of GRADE and Evidence to Decision for an interventional study design. The following concepts were covered:

Day 1: Foundations of Systematic Reviews

Sessions focused on the fundamentals of systematic reviews, with the introduction to randomized controlled trials (RCTs) as the building blocks for systematic reviews, components of systematic reviews, development of systematic review protocols, and literature search strategies. Participants also engaged in hands-on training on search strategies and sessions on screening and data extraction.

Day 2: Quality Assessment & Evidence Synthesis

Focused on meta-analysis and risk of bias assessment, interactive sessions on the principles of meta-analysis along with hands-on exercises. risk of bias assessment in randomized controlled trials, including the ROB 2 tool, followed by practical hands-on training.

Day 3: Interpretation, Reporting & Application

Emphasized interpretation and application of evidence in healthcare guideline development. The sessions by Dr. Pradhap Tharyan included the assessment of certainty of evidence using the GRADE approach, preparation of Summary of Findings (SoF) tables, and practical exercises. Participants were also introduced to the process of guideline development, formation of Guideline Development Groups (GDGs), topic prioritization, framing of clinical questions, and the use of systematic reviews for guidelines and policy development.

Day 4: Guideline Development

Focused on translating evidence into guideline recommendations. The sessions by Dr. Pradhap Tharyan included the EtD framework, practical examples of GDG EtD frameworks, and translating evidence into recommendations using examples such as the Index TB Guidelines and malaria treatment recommendations. Participants also engaged in practical exercises using GRADEpro/GDT to develop Summary of Findings tables, evidence profiles, and EtD frameworks. Additional sessions addressed stakeholder engagement, declaration and management of conflicts of interest, and communication of guideline recommendations to diverse stakeholders. The workshop concluded with discussions, feedback, and closing remarks.

The workshop faculty team included Dr. Pradhap Tharyan (Adjunct Faculty, CEU), Dr. Mohan S. Kamath (Professor, RMU), Dr. Vignesh Kumar (Professor, CEU). The sessions were highly interactive, encouraging active participation from attendees.

A total of 21 participants attended the workshop, including 3 participants from other institutions across India. The participants expressed appreciation for the well-structured sessions and showed keen interest in attending future workshops organized by the department.

The department extends its gratitude to all resource persons, the Principal's Office for their support, and the Telemedicine and Online Teams for ensuring the smooth conduct of the workshop.
