Dr. Jacob Peedicayil Retires



Dr. Jacob Peedicayil joined for MBBS in 1977 and for MD in pharmacology in 1991, both at CMC Vellore. From 1993 to 1995 he underwent training in cell and molecular biology at Centre for Cellular and Molecular Biology, Hyderabad. From 1995 to 1998 he was a Research Fellow in the Department of Neurosciences, CMC Vellore, following which he joined the faculty of the Department of Pharmacology & Clinical Pharmacology in CMC. He was actively involved in UG and PG teaching in the department, guiding several PG students in their theses. He has made a distinctive research contribution in two totally different areas of biomedicine, namely, theoretical epigenetics and experimental smooth muscle pharmacology. He has published 80 PubMed-indexed articles, co-edited 2 editions of 2 books on neuropsychiatric epigenetics entitled *Epigenetics in Psychiatry and Neuropsychiatric Disorders* and *Epigenetics* published by Elsevier, USA, and additionally has written 9 book chapters on pharmacoeugenetics and psychiatric epigenetics published by Elsevier, USA and Taylor & Francis, UK.

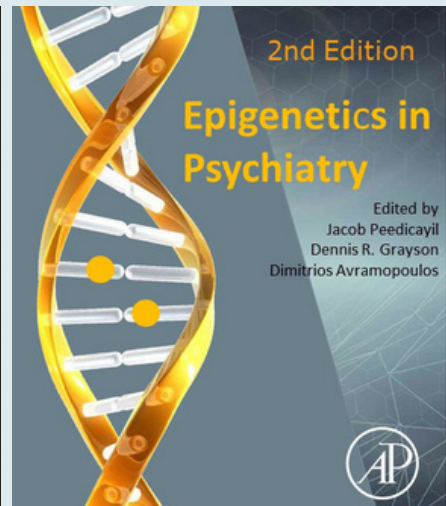

CMC Vellore Launches Antenatal Screening Echocardiography Service

Christian Medical College Vellore, launched a dedicated Antenatal Screening Echocardiography Service to enable the early detection of previously unrecognised heart disease in pregnant women. The service was dedicated by the Council Chairman, Ms. Anuvinda Varkey, in the presence of the Director, Dr. Biju George, on June 26, 2026.

The service is available through the Department of Cardiology for asymptomatic pregnant women with no known history of heart disease who are referred by their obstetrician for screening. It is part of a Tamil Nadu Government initiative spearheaded at CMC by the Medical Superintendent, Dr. Rajesh I, and his office.

Screening is available on all working days at the ISSCC Building on the CMC Vellore Town Campus and will also be offered on designated days at the peripheral centres—CHAD at Bagayam, LCECU, and RUHSA.

Pregnancy places additional demands on the heart and circulation. Although most women have uncomplicated pregnancies, some may have previously undiagnosed heart disease that can become clinically significant during pregnancy and childbirth, affecting both mother and baby. Screening ECHO can identify conditions such as rheumatic and congenital heart disease, cardiomyopathies, valvular abnormalities, pulmonary hypertension, and other structural or functional cardiac disorders. Early detection allows timely specialist evaluation and appropriate management. The new service reflects CMC Vellore's continued commitment to excellence in patient care.



World Blood Donor Day Celebration 2026

Welcome & Inaugural Session

The forum commenced with an invocation and inaugural ceremony led by Rev. Rainard Pearson, Senior Chaplain, followed by an opening note from Dr. Azariah Jeba Kumar, Senior Librarian & Head, Department of Library Services, who welcomed the delegates and highlighted the importance of collaboration and knowledge sharing within the health sciences library community.

The final session was on the topic, *The Modern Research Ecosystem: Content, Discovery & Insights*; led by Wolters Kluwer - Ovid Team.

GERIMASTER 2026



The Department of Geriatrics, Christian Medical College Vellore, under the aegis of the Indian Academy of Geriatrics (IAG), successfully conducted the second edition of GERIMASTER, its Postgraduate Masterclass in Geriatric Medicine, from 25th – 27th June 2026. The three-day academic programme brought together 65 postgraduate students and practitioners from across the country for an engaging and enriching learning experience in the ever-evolving field of geriatrics.

The masterclass commenced with an inspiring inaugural session, featuring addresses by Dr. Vinod Abraham and Dr. Betty Simon, following a warm welcome by Prof. Prasad Mathews, Prof. Alka Ganesh, mentor to many of the faculty members in the Department of Geriatrics, delivered an inspiring message, setting the tone for three days of academic excellence, innovation, and collaborative learning.

The scientific programme which covered the theme when guidelines collide-managing multimorbidity included a broad spectrum of topics essential to comprehensive geriatric care. Participants explored multidisciplinary team-based care, interpretation of pulmonary function tests, approach to electrolyte disorders, frailty, sarcopenia, geriatric assessment scales, anaemia, radiological evaluation, dermatological disorders, and sensory impairment in older adults. Sessions on principles of geriatric oncology, haematology, problems with visions and swallow and symptom management in palliative care highlighted the continuum of care required for older persons, while an interactive session on research methodology provided practical insights into matching research questions with appropriate study designs.

One of the distinguishing features of GERIMASTER was its emphasis on experiential learning. Hands-on bedside clinics allowed participants to translate theory into clinical practice under expert supervision. Faculty from Pulmonary Medicine, Cardiology, Vascular Surgery, Haematology, and Neurology shared recent advances in their respective specialties, while geriatricians facilitated discussions on adapting these advances to the complex needs of older adults living with multimorbidity and polypharmacy. Reflecting the rapidly changing landscape of medicine, the programme also included sessions on the application of artificial intelligence in geriatric practice and a collaborative hackathon, where participants worked in small interdisciplinary groups to solve real-world clinical challenges.

Adding an element of excitement, the postgraduate quiz proved to be one of the most anticipated events of GERIMASTER. The spirited competition showcased the participants' knowledge, teamwork, and enthusiasm, making it a memorable highlight of the programme. GERIMASTER 2026 concluded on a high note, with participants leaving not only with enhanced clinical knowledge and practical skills, but also with renewed compassion, confidence, and commitment to providing holistic, person-centred care for older adults.



Session for Staff Children “How to face an interview”



The Personnel Department organised a session titled “How to Face an Interview” for staff children on 22nd June 2026. A total of 79 students participated in the programme, which was conducted from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The session was organised for staff children who had successfully completed their Class XII examinations, cleared the entrance examinations conducted by CMC, and been shortlisted for interviews for Nursing and Allied Health Sciences (AHS) courses.

The programme included sessions on choosing an appropriate course, the history and values of CMC, interview etiquette and dress code, as well as practical guidance and tips for facing interviews with confidence. The resource person, Col. Dr. Paul Prathap, HR Consultant, Chennai, shared valuable insights and advice drawn from his extensive experience. The students found the sessions highly informative and beneficial, particularly at a time when they are making important decisions regarding their higher education and future careers. The programme helped equip them with the knowledge and confidence needed to approach their interviews successfully.
